# Concert installation for 6 piano players \& piano rolls, with choreography, lighting, video projection \& sound diffusion. Video film: Olalla Lemus.

duration: ca. 30 mins.

The title takes its origins from an earlier work written for mechanical player piano and piano player. The purely functional role assigned earlier to a perforated score as something to be 'read' by the machine, is displaced by its re-appearance as an object installed in space. This contradiction is highlighted by the use of electric pianos instruments with no 'mechanism' as such - instead of acoustic pianos for the performance.


#### Abstract

Scenario: Spotlights are projected on to the arena around the stage area. The public enters, followed later by the players, dressed in gaudy, tatty tails and absorbed in the task of unravelling an 'object' - a scroll of a piano roll. The sound of the paper is very audible in this process. Sometimes they pause motionless in mid-movement, unexpectedly and independently, their gesture 'frozen' like a tableau, before continuing and perhaps choosing another tempo of movement. There are spontaneous encounters between performers and public as the paper is moved and gradually installed in the space, hung vertically on suspended threads with hooks attached.

The arena lighting fades out in a cross-fade with a build of profile-spot back-light on to the suspended note rolls. The performers take up their places at the keyboards. Very focussed centre-stage lighting is projected on the keyboards.

The music begins. There are moments when some of the players 'freeze' in midmotion whilst playing, the others continuing. Important is the sustained tension during this stillness, in which they must avoid any movement such as page turning otherwise the dramatic effect will be lost to the audience.

Towards the end of the work, (after a long multiple glissando), each pianist begins to play 'silently', depressing the keys with no resulting sound, slowing down their movement in staggered succession until the final one is completed. During this time the back-lighting on the piano rolls is faded out and video projection on to their front surface commences. The players hold their last posture in absolute stillness until the film finishes ( 2 minutes). A 10 second pause concludes the work, during which centre stage lights fade slowly to complete blackout.


## Technical requirements:

6 electric keyboards with their standing monitor speakers.
4 larger Genelec speakers, amplifier, mixing desk.
Video projector, DVD player.
Lighting rig, PC Profile spots, Fresnels, dimmer board.

## Materials:

6 piano rolls with frame strips at top and bottom.
Suspended invisible thread.
The parts are rolled onto a simple cardboard cylinder and unfurled at the keyboard.

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## Scenario

## Entrance: (see sketch)

LIGHT - (soft Fresnels) large corridors of light on the arena surrounding centre stage.
The 6 performers enter dressed in tatty tails, carrying / dragging / unfurling piano rolls as they move through the audience, and approaching the area where the cords are suspended.

With the help of audience members, they install each one on its hook so that it hangs from the cord and leaving the unwound remains on the floor.

Performers take up their positions at the keyboards.
LIGHTS on centre stage. Arena lights off. Spotlight(s) from behind piano rolls on.
The music begins.
Each player has sudden moments of long silence during the performance, during which they should remain absolutely still, as though 'frozen' in mid-play. (see sketch)

This requires some choreography in terms of score page shifting, so that this is not done during the long silences as it would break the intended dramatic tension.

Ending:
BACKLIGHT behind piano rolls off as the players move their hands across the keyboard producing no sound (volume off) in 'silent playing'.

Meanwhile the video (without sound) is projected on to the surface of the piano rolls. (see sketch)

FADE lights on centre stage very slowly.
Players gradually slow down to a stop and remain motionless in that position.
End of film.
